Why focus on teaching these high-frequency verbs?

- Because the 100 most frequently used words account for 65% of all speech.
- Verbs are most of those top 100 words.
- Teaching verbs allows students to understand stories right away.
- It's natural speech. Most teenagers use only 800 words a day outside of school.
- Language learner authors know this and use these verbs in their novels.

**JUMP-START BEGINNERS IN MOST LANGUAGES BY TEACHING THESE VERBS IN  
THE PRESENT TENSE, 3<sup>RD</sup> PERSON SINGULAR WITH CLASSICAL TPR GESTURES

With some imagination, almost any story can be told or adapted with the first 26 verbs alone.**

## **ESSENTIAL VERBS** 26 verbs that are used by everyone, all the time      (High Frequency)
